First Lesson

Jonah 3:1-5, 10

set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. Jonah began to go into the

Christ Church's Seal Travels to the Abu Simbel Temples

This past week, Christ Church's Seal traveled to the Abu Simbel Temples in Egypt. Joining our Seal were Christ Church communicants Steve and Monti Acuff, David and Claudia Seyle and Irene Feddern. Construction of the temple complex started in approximately 1264 B.C. and lasted for about 20 years, until 1244 BC. Known as the "Temple of Ramesses, beloved by Amun" it was one of six rock temples erected in Nubia during the long reign of Ramesses II (b. 1303 BCE and d. 1213 BCE; reigned 1279-1213 BCE).
